Service of Installation

The records from the Milwaukee Baptist Church and then Greenfield Baptist Church do not have any mention of installation of new pastors, "laying of hands", or other type of ceremony. They were on the

US frontier. Mostly farmers, they were just happy to have a pastor.

In the early days, there are entries of approval to send requests to the national missionary board for supplying a preacher and even funds. Other entries mentioned approval of a shared

preacher to speak every fourth Sunday for \$50 a year.

The bottom line is we do not know when our initial "installation ceremony" was conducted.

We do know that a "SERVICE OF INSTALLATION" was conducted for Rev. Mark Weisser over thirty years ago on September 20, 1992. Participants as listed on the program were: Rev Eleanor Cardenas, Rev George Daniels, David Fellows, Kenneth Gleesing, John Gregg,

Rev Scott Weisser, Joyce Radtke, Ted Hertel, Sr., Mary Schecher, Karl Byleen, Henry Canitz, and Ted Hertel, Jr. Unfortunately -- and oddly enough! -- no photographs of that service appear to have been taken.

There were also hymns, special music, and, most importantly, Pastor Gwen's covenant to serve the congregation as a minister of Jesus, as well as the congregation's commitment to work together with our new pastor to support her with prayer and participation. Church members were called forward to lay hands on the pastor as a symbol of sharing together with her in the Church's ministry and mission.

Undoubtedly, the laying on of hands in the early church was a means of connecting the message with the messenger, or the spiritual gift with the gifted giver. It provided a symbolic sign authenticating the pastor through whom the physical manifestation of a spiritual gift was

bestowed. There are no magical biblical formulas for the ministry of the church. Laying on of hands has no power in itself. Symbolically, our members laid our hands on Pastor Gwen at the Conclusion of the service as we made our mutual commitments.

Then, after the benediction and following our local Baptist traditions, we
